Day 1 Chaperone Program:

For Day 1, FLC is preparing a special program for chaperones. From 9:30-11:30, chaperones are encouraged to participate in a self-guided tour of the Capitol, Florida Historic Capitol Museum, Supreme Court, and Museum of Florida History. These locations are all within a few blocks of City Hall and all locations are free. The Florida Room (at City Hall) will also be available for chaperones to use. At lunch, chaperones will rejoin the youth for lunch. After lunch, the City of Tallahassee has prepared a special presentation.

Parking:

- The suggested method of transportation to get to/from City Hall/FLC is Uber/Lyft. Kleman Plaza parking garage has limited parking and generally fills up by 8:00 a.m. Parking in Kleman costs \$6.00 per day.
- For those who travel via bus, there is a loading zone located on College Ave for drop off/pick up only.
