SUBJECT: REFERRAL TO THE SUSTAINABILITY AND RESILIENCY COMMITTEE -
DISCUSSION ON REQUIRING ALL NEW CITY VEHICLES PURCHASED
AFTER 2020 TO BE 100% ELECTRIC (EXCEPT EMERGENCY VEHICLES).

ANALYSIS

Please place on the September 11 Commission agenda, a referral to the Sustainability and Resiliency Committee to begin the process of requiring all new City vehicles purchased after 2020 to be 100% Electric (except emergency vehicles). The Sustainability Committee passed a motion in May to support fleet management reductions of CO2 emissions. These vehicles have a lower total cost of ownership than traditional gasoline vehicles. New York City now operates more than 1,224 on-road EVs and plug-in hybrids and released a report that says "Electric cars are now the cheapest option for its fleet" <https://qz.com/1571956/new-york-city-says-electric-cars-cheapest-option-for-its-fleet/>.
