

## **MBPD POLICING PLAN - 10/30/19 COMMISSION MEETING**

1. Increase the visibility of police officers and code enforcement officers in areas with reoccurring crimes against pedestrians.
  - a. Park and Walk Details have been implemented throughout the city, specifically in the areas where pedestrian traffic is heavier.
  - b. Area Captains are tracking park and walk details as units have been instructed to advise our Public Safety Communications Unit when doing so.
  - c. Bicycle details specifically on Ocean Drive, Lincoln Road, and 41<sup>st</sup> Street are still in effect and actively used to facilitate further community policing efforts. Our newly formed Community Affairs Unit will be taking this tactic into various neighborhoods throughout the city.
  - d. Area Units, Beat Officers, Homeless Outreach, and our Crime Suppression Team are continuously monitoring known chronic habitual offenders. This continued humanitarian effort is being made with the hopes of placing the most desperate of these chronic offenders, many of which have lifelong mental health and substance abuse issues, into treatment plans. Those refusing placement will be subject to the new misdemeanor probation program that we plan to roll out in December of this year.
  - e. Area Captains have encouraged their personnel to take a more proactive stance towards community engagement by rolling down their windows when patrolling a predominately residential area. In areas such as Ocean Drive and 41<sup>st</sup> Street, this practice has been the norm for many years.
2. CEPTED have been the practice and norm in the City of Miami Beach since the early 2000s. All of our NROs have received advanced CEPTED training and are currently called upon to utilize this expertise when evaluating other elements of the city's infrastructure. Efforts have been made in the past to have CEPTED introduced formally into city policy as it pertains to new construction. The MBPD stands ready to further this effort if called upon to do so.
