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A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA, ADOPTING THE FIFTTH AMENDMENT TO THE GENERAL FUND, ENTERPRISE FUNDS, INTERNAL SERVICE FUNDS, AND SPECIAL REVENUE FUNDS BUDGETS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2020 AS SET FORTH IN THIS RESOLUTION AND IN THE ATTACHED EXHIBIT "A."

WHEREAS, on September 25, 2019, the Mayor and City Commission adopted the budgets for the General Fund, Enterprise Funds, Internal Service Funds, and Special Revenue Funds for Fiscal Year 2020 via Resolution No. 2019-31004; and

WHEREAS, on November 25, 2019, the First Amendment to the General Fund, Enterprise Funds, Internal Service Funds, and Special Revenue Funds budgets for Fiscal Year 2020 was adopted via Resolution No. 2019-31081; and

WHEREAS, on January 15, 2020, the Second Amendment to the General Fund, Enterprise Funds, Internal Service Funds, and Special Revenue Funds budgets for Fiscal Year 2020 was adopted via Resolution No. 2020-31138; and

WHEREAS, on February 12, 2020, the Third Amendment to the General Fund, Enterprise Funds, Internal Service Funds, and Special Revenue Funds budgets for Fiscal Year 2020 was adopted via Resolution No. 2020-31178; and

WHEREAS, on May 13, 2020, the Fourth Amendment to the General Fund, Enterprise Funds, Internal Service Funds, and Special Revenue Funds budgets for Fiscal Year 2020 was adopted via Resolution No. 2020-31268; and

WHEREAS, at the June 12, 2020 Finance and Economic Resiliency Committee ("FERC") meeting, the City Administration presented an item to discuss the appropriation of up to \$700,000 from the City's General Fund reserves to support rent, mortgage, and utilities assistance programs for qualified City residents impacted by the economic crisis resulting from COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, based on the recommendation of the FERC on June 12, 2020, this proposed budget amendment would appropriate \$330,000 of prior year General Fund fund balance for the City to provide additional rent assistance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT DULY RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA, that following a duly noticed public hearing on June 24, 2020, the Mayor and City Commission hereby adopt the Fifth Amendment to the Fiscal Year 2020 General Fund, Enterprise Fund, Internal Service Fund, and Special Revenue Funds budgets as set forth in this Resolution and in the attached Exhibit "A."
