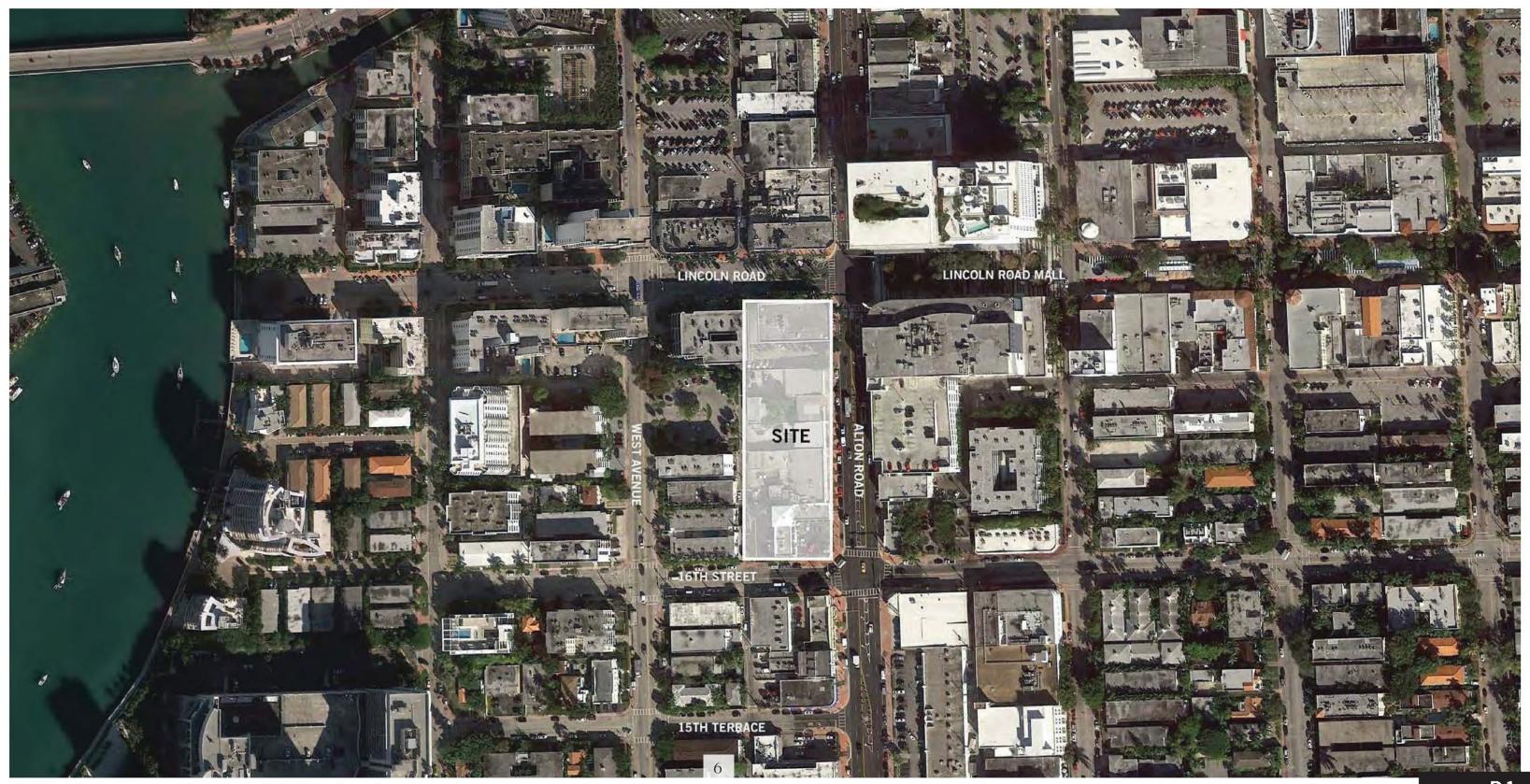

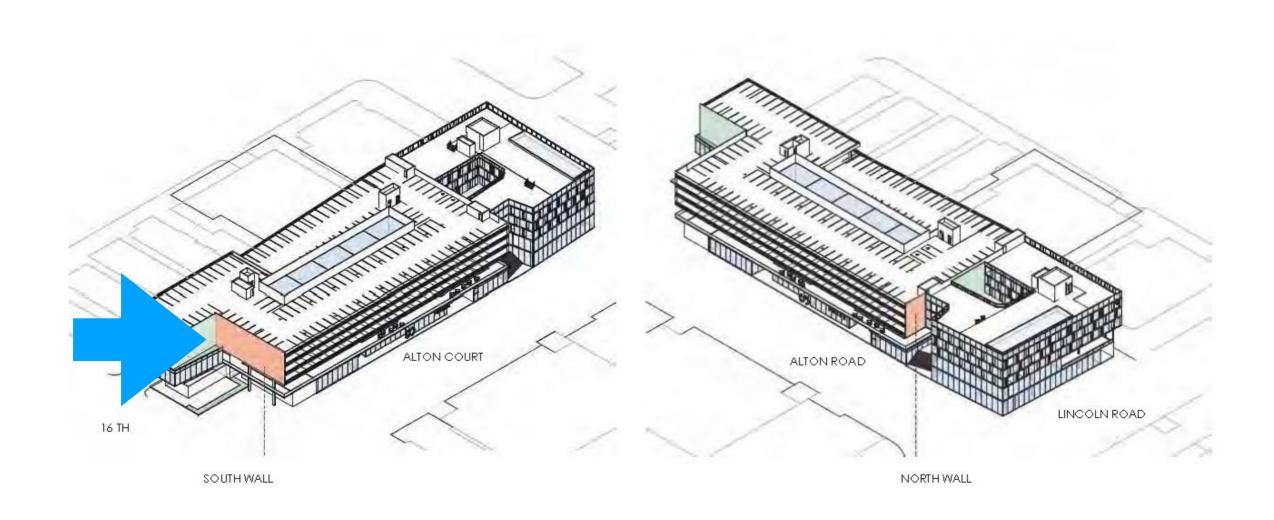

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA, RELATING TO THE APPEAL (DRB APPEAL FILE NO. 2017-002) OF A DESIGN REVIEW APPROVAL ASSOCIATED WITH DESIGN REVIEW BOARD FILE NO. 0416-0015, FOR THE SOUTH-FACING NONCOMMERCIAL ELECTRONIC GRAPHIC PROPOSED TO BE INSTALLED AT 1600-1634 ALTON ROAD/1212 LINCOLN ROAD; AND APPROVING THE SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT, ATTACHED HERETO AS EXHIBIT "A," BETWEEN THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, AND RESPONDENTS ARRP MIAMI, LLC, 1212 LINCOLN, LLC, AND WELLS FARGO BANK (HEREINAFTER, COLLECTIVELY, THE "RESPONDENTS").

WHEREAS, the City Manager of the City of Miami Beach filed an appeal, (DRB Appeal File No.: 2017-002), to the City Commission, of a Design Review Board ("DRB") order, pursuant to City Code Section 118-9(c)(2)(B); and

WHEREAS, the underlying DRB Application, under DRB File No. 0416-0015, was filed by ARRP Miami, LLC, 1212 Lincoln, LLC, and Wells Fargo Bank (hereinafter, collectively, the "Respondents") for design review approval which, in pertinent part, included the installation of artistic non-commercial electronic graphics on the north and south elevations of a proposed new five-story commercial building with accessory parking and a hotel component, located at 1212

WHEREAS, at that quasi-judicial public hearing, the DRB approved two artistic noncommercial electronic graphics: one facing south, at a proposed size of approximately 90' 2" wide and 37' 2" high, for a total area of approximately 3,380 square feet (the "South Wall Graphic"); and one facing north, at a proposed size of 24' 5" wide and 43' 8" high, for a total area of approximately 1,063 square feet (the "North Wall Graphic") (See DRB Order, attached

WHEREAS, the City Manager sought appellate review by the City Commission of only the South Wall Graphic, which is proposed to be installed on the exterior of the proposed project, facing 16<sup>th</sup> Street, at a size of approximately 3,380 square feet; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager did not appeal the DRB decision as to the North Wall Graphic, as that graphic is proposed to be installed in the interior of the project, and as it would be predominantly exposed to an internal courtyard away from the public right-of-way; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager sought appellate review as to the South Wall Graphic on the basis that the DRB's decision was not supported by competent substantial evidence, particularly with regard to the size and brightness of the proposed South Wall Graphic; and

WHEREAS, in order to avoid costly litigation and delays, and to minimize the impacts of the proposed South Wall Graphic on the surrounding neighborhood, the City Manager and representatives of the Respondents met and negotiated the Settlement Agreement attached

  - b. The proposed inventory in its entirety of the imagery <u>shall not</u> be approved as proposed. The only electronic graphics and images approved shall be the Enzo Gallo mural designs, which are conceived as high quality photographs of the throughout the LED panels.
  - c. The proposed digital LED screens shall not be approved as proposed. The architect shall incorporate "Option 3" for the Sansi S/Video technology that blends moving imagery and graphics to architecture in a more refined and advanced method, as presented in the supplemental exhibit distributed at the October 03, 2017 DRB meeting.
- d. The electronic graphics and images **shall** be approved as proposed.
- e. The moving electronic graphics and images shall be approved as proposed.

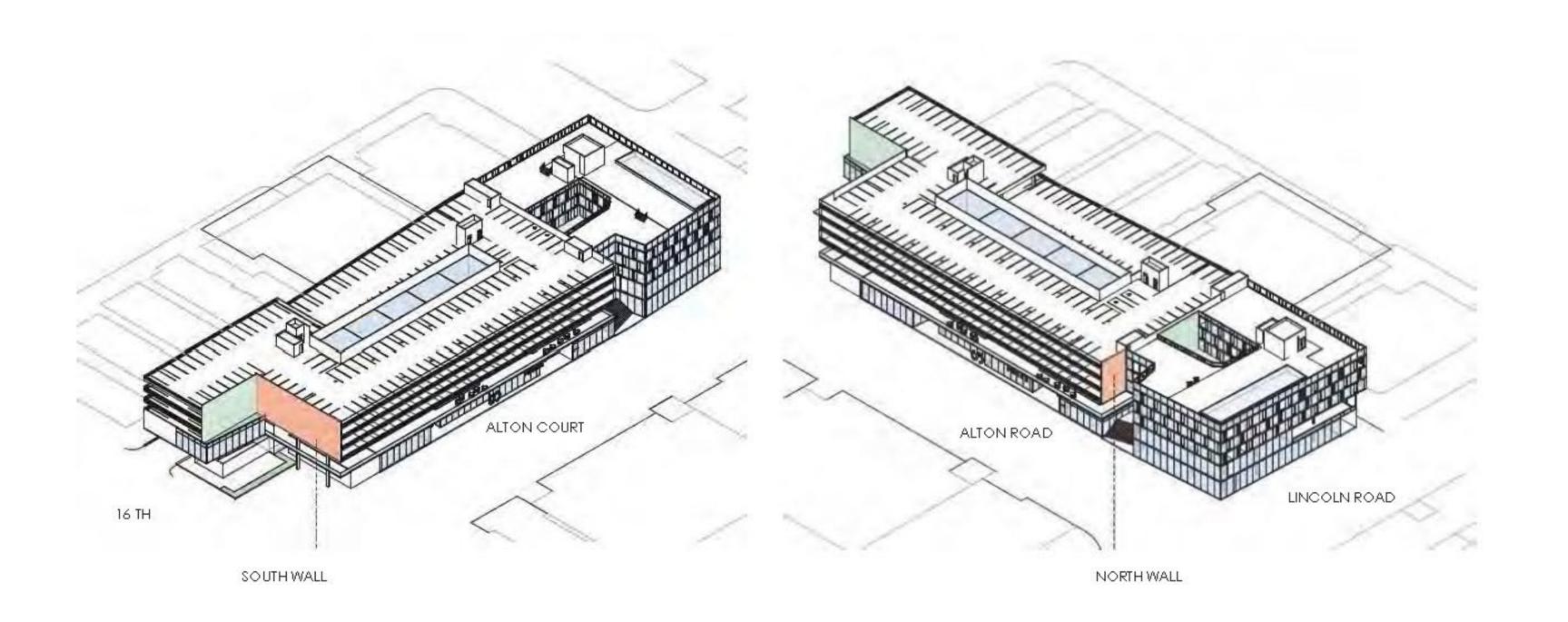
Modified Condition I(G)(iii) The LED panels must be modulated so that, from sunset to midnight, the brightness shall not be more than 500 Nits and no more than 250 Nits from midnight to sunrise. Sunrise and Sunset times are those times established by the Miami office of the National Weather Service. At all other times, the maximum brightness levels may not exceed 5,000 Nits. The panels shall have installed ambient light monitors and at all times shall allow such monitors to automatically adjust the brightness level of the sign based on ambient light conditions. The images on the LED panels, murals, graphics or images shall be reduced in illumination to a maximum of 250 Nits from Midnight - 7:00 a.m.

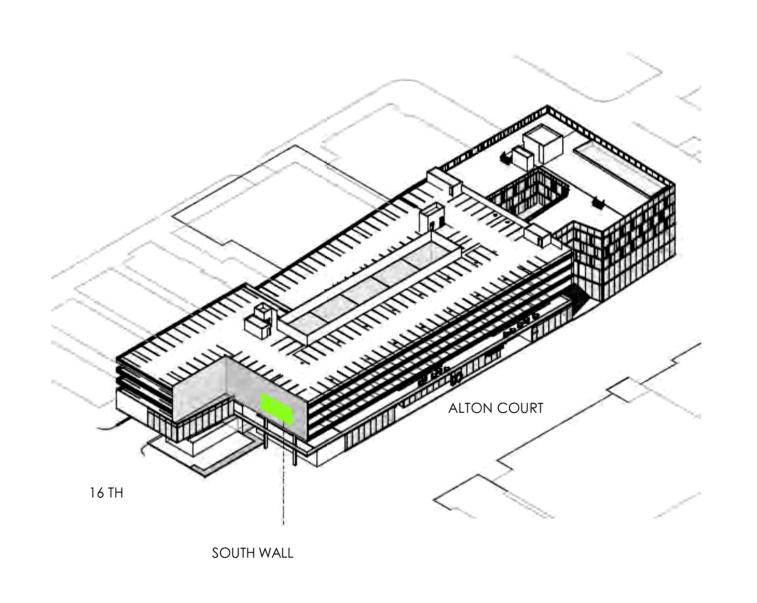

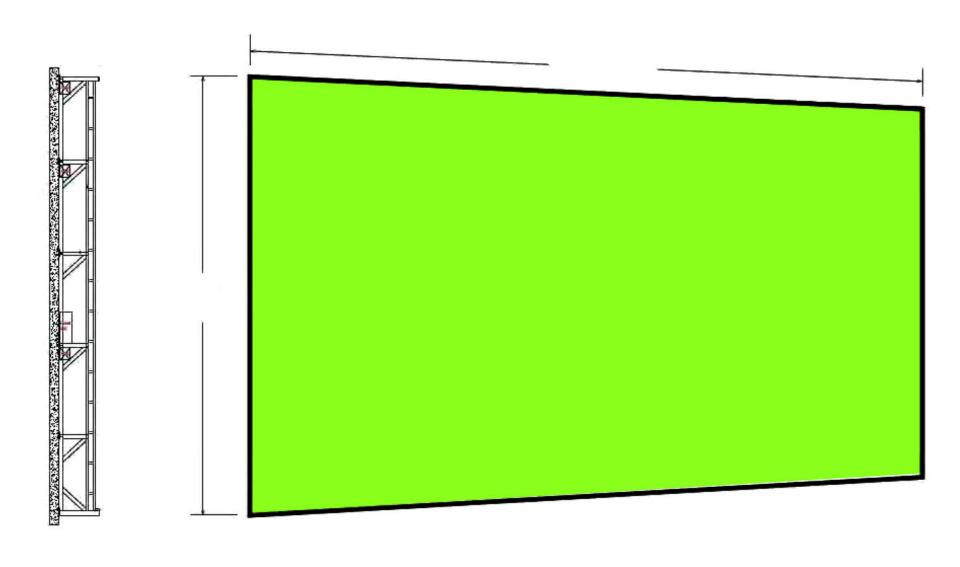

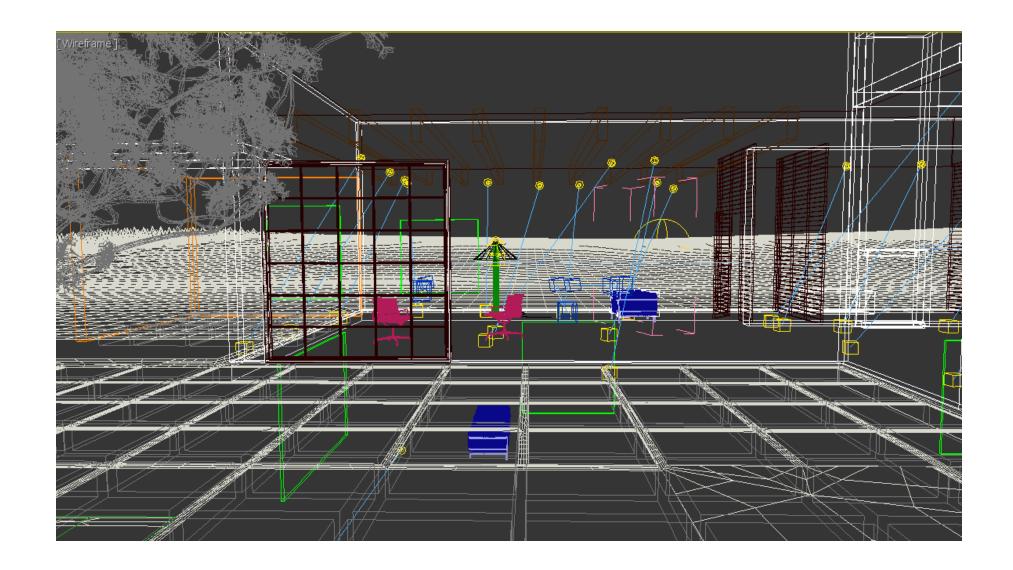

These surreal landscapes offer viewers the opportunity to witness never before seen artworks... As never before achieved in Contemporary Art.

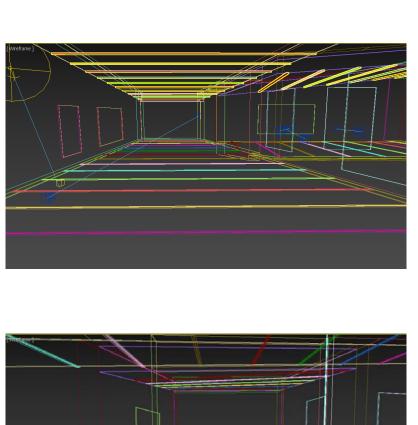

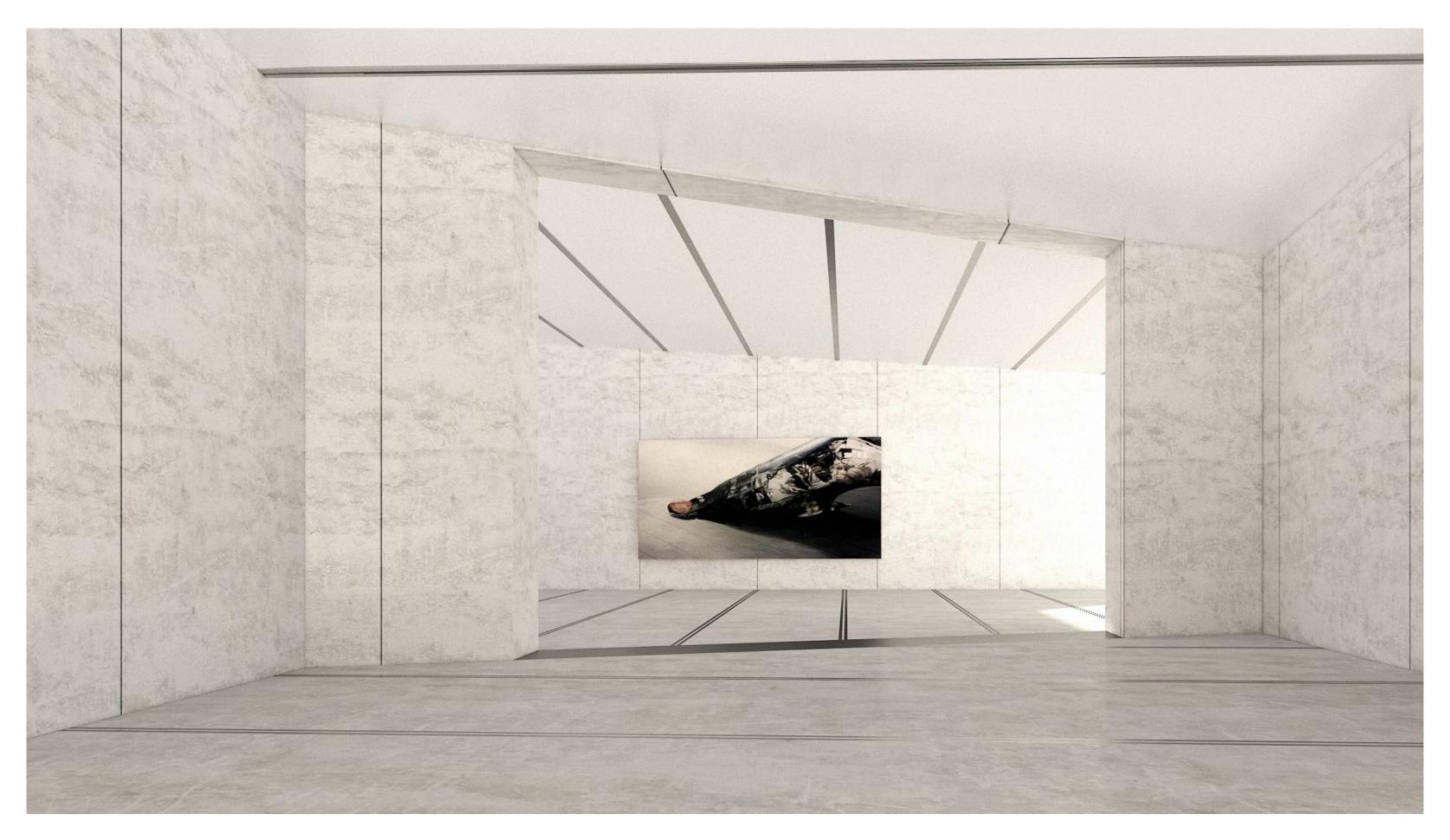
Leo Castañeda (b. Cali, Colombia 1988) is an experimental game designer and multi-media artist living in Miami, FL. Fusing gaming, painting, virtual reality, drawing, and interactive sculpture, Castañeda's work probes how the language and structures of video games intersect with the world at large. Through open mythologies built across feedback loops between analog and digital, Castañeda's work reimagines the corporeal, ecological, and socio-political anatomies that govern our cultural operating systems.

Castañeda received his BFA from Cooper Union in 2010 and MFA at Hunter College in 2014.

Residencies include SOMA Mexico City (2014); "Of Games III" at Khoj International in NewDelhi India (2015); Bronx Museum AIM Fellowship (2017), and Oolite Arts Studio Residency (2018–2019). In 2019 the Wolfsonian-FIU Museum commissioned Castañeda to create a video animation. He is also a recipient of South Florida Cultural Consortium Visual/Media Artists Fellowship, Locust Projects Wavemaker Grant, and Oolite Arts Ellies Creator Award. After two years as a professor of 3-D animation at Florida International University, Castañeda currently teaches 3-D animation at New World School of the Arts.

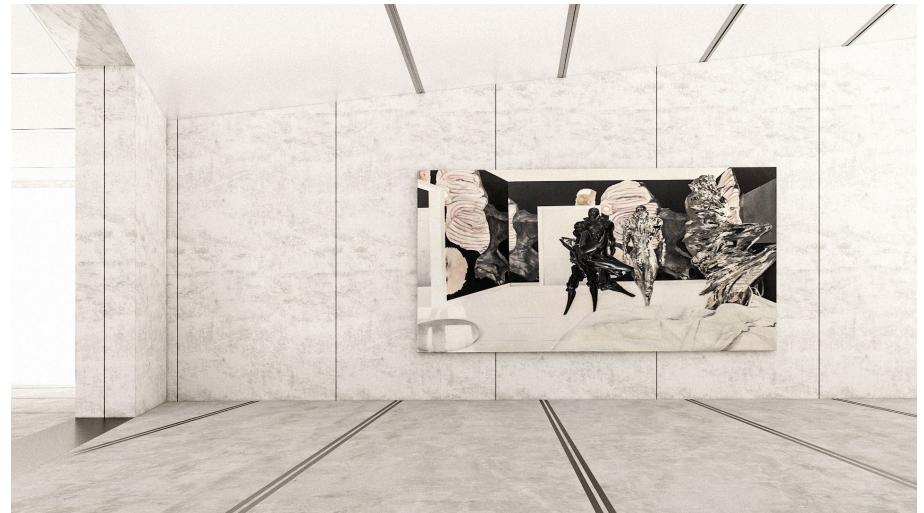

He currently lives and works in Columbus, IN.



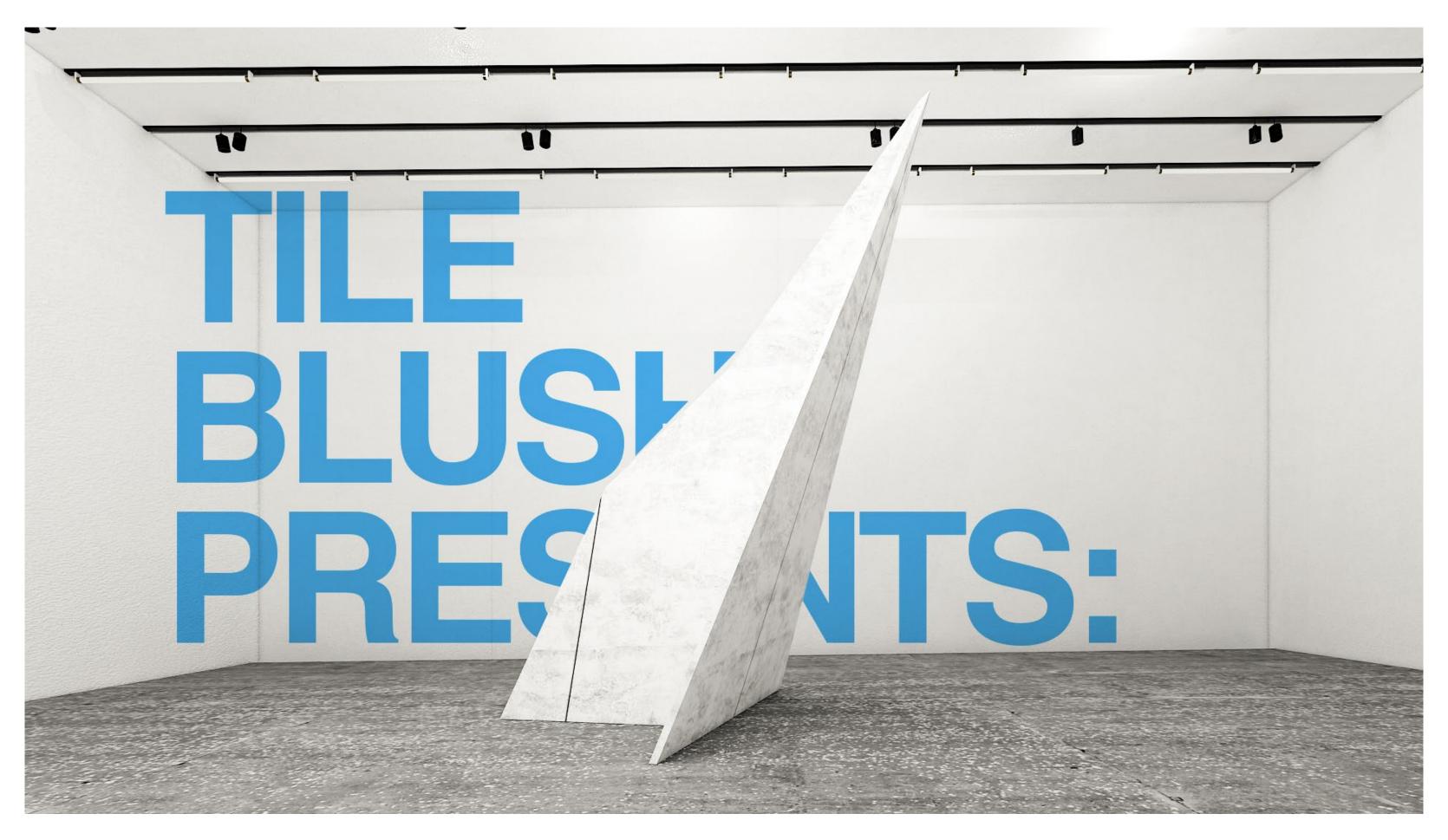

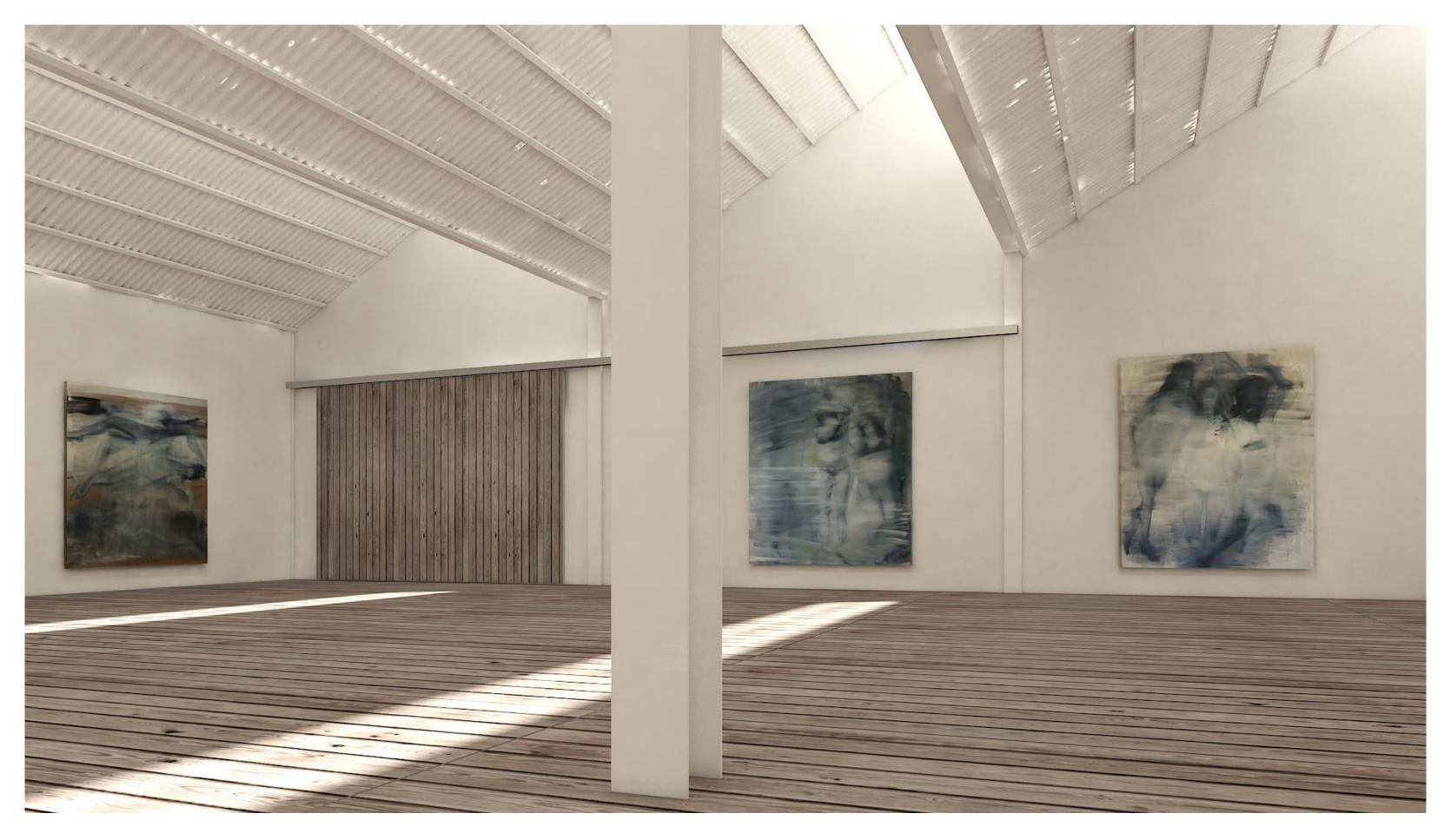
Anna Vickers was born in Berlin and has lived and worked in London and currently in Paris.

### Nicolas Buffe

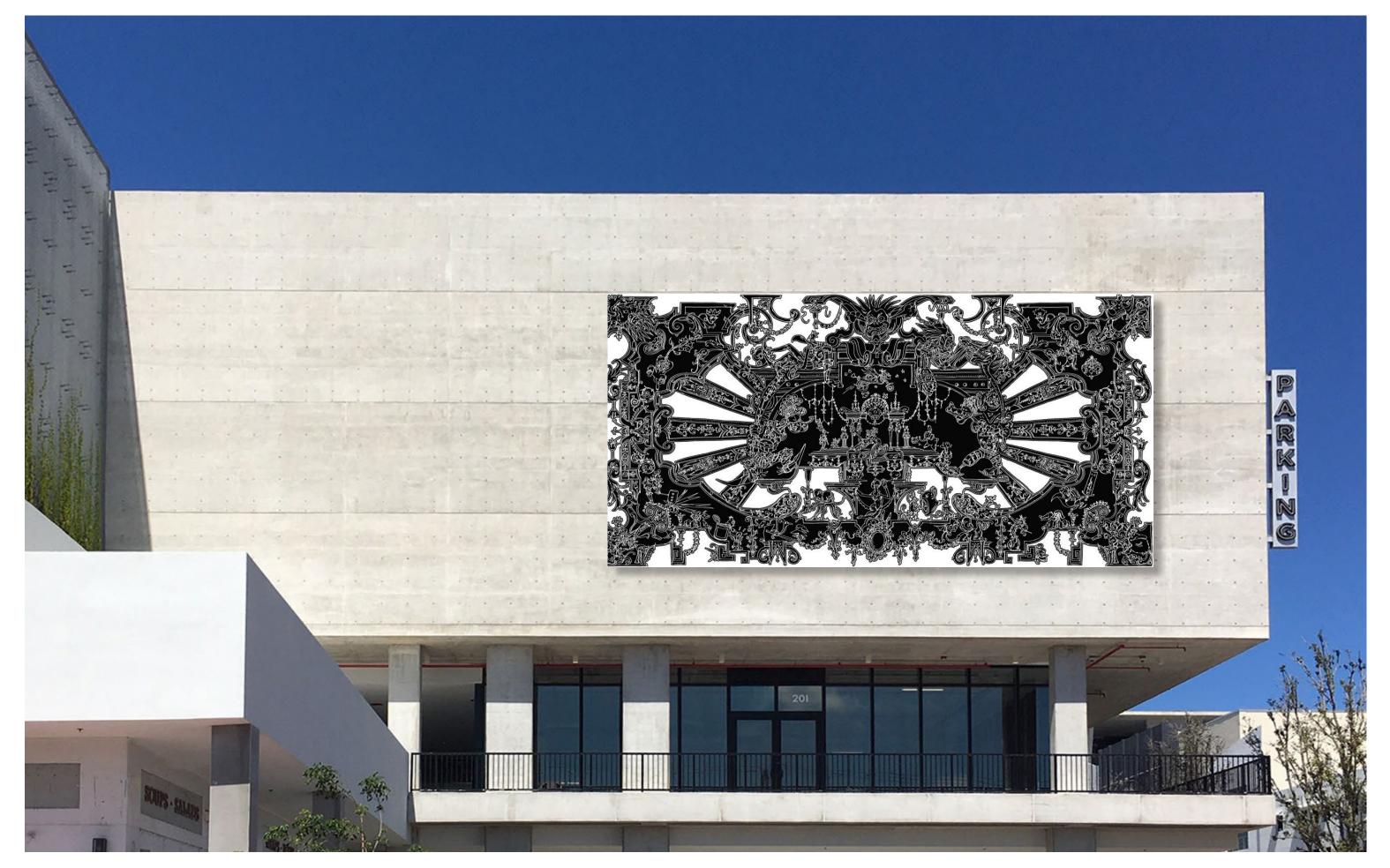

#### PROFILE:

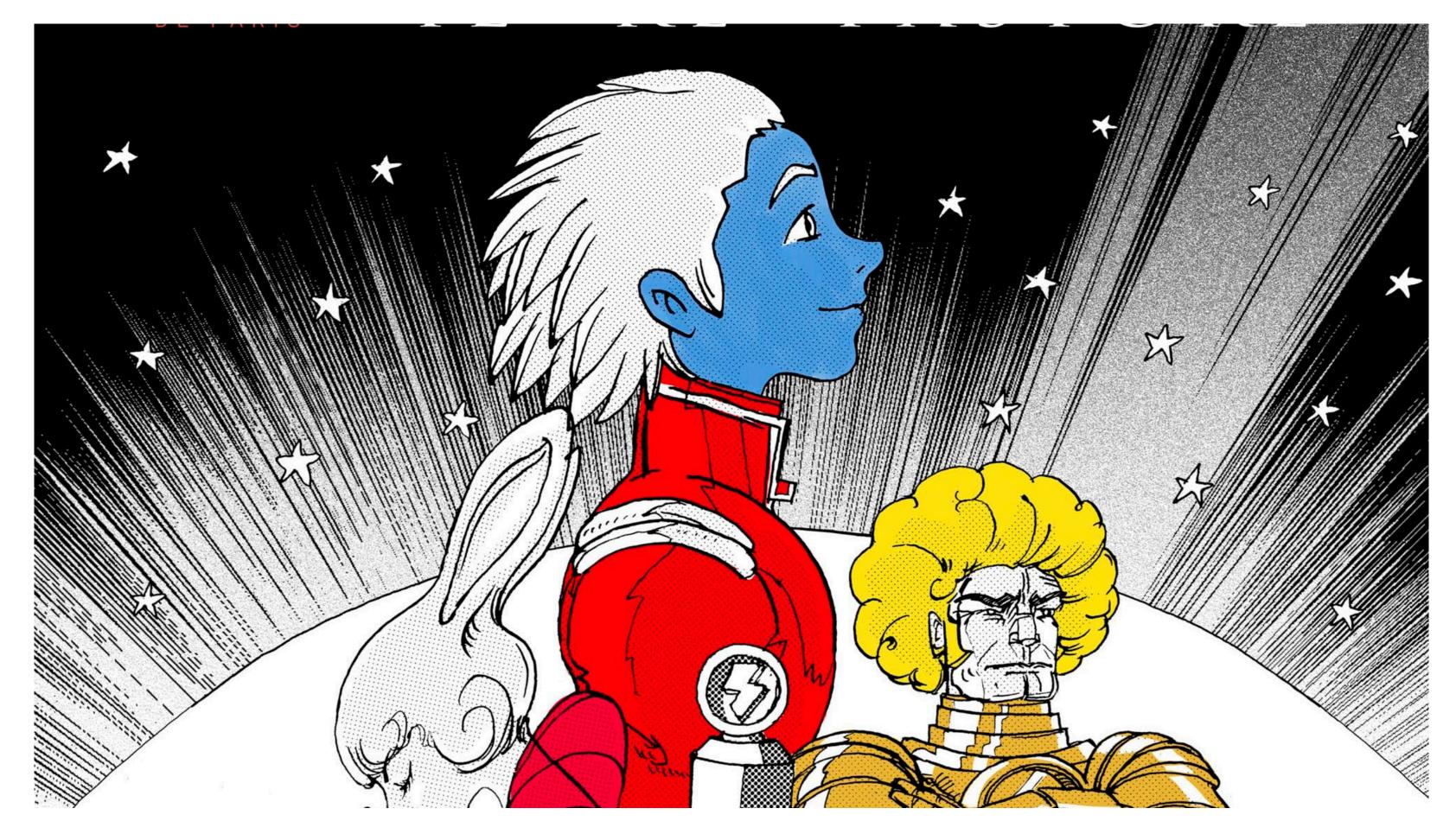
Nicolas Buffe, a French artist based in Tokyo, is the creator behind a multifaceted, interdisciplinary world combining erudite and popular culture.

Born in 1978, he belongs to a generation naturally marked by Japanese culture, developing from childhood a passion for cartoons, manga and video games. These references were supplemented throughout the course of his studies by classic works of the Middle Ages and the Renaissance, such as The Romance of the Rose and The Dream of Poliphilus. This blending of narrative and visual influences is omnipresent in his work, which is based on the humanistic notion of «serio ludere» or «playing seriously».

His work has been presented in France and internationally through exhibitions and outstanding installations, such as in La Maison Rouge (2007, Le Vestibule), Tokyo Contemporary art museum (2008), MAD Paris (2010, Circuit Céramique), Hara Museum of contemporary art de Tokyo (2014, soloshow), Théâtre du Châtelet – Paris and Nijō Castle – Kyoto (Nuit Blanche 2016), French May at Hong Kong City Hall, and K11 Hong Kong (2017 soloshows), Sèvres: 300 Creative years (2017-2018, Suntory Museum – Tokyo and Osaka, Hagi, Shizuoka). Roppongi Art Night (2018, Tokyo) and Magiques Licornes at Musée de Cluny – Paris (2018-19). Over the winter of 2018-2019, he set up a monumental installation inside Ginza Six in Tokyo.

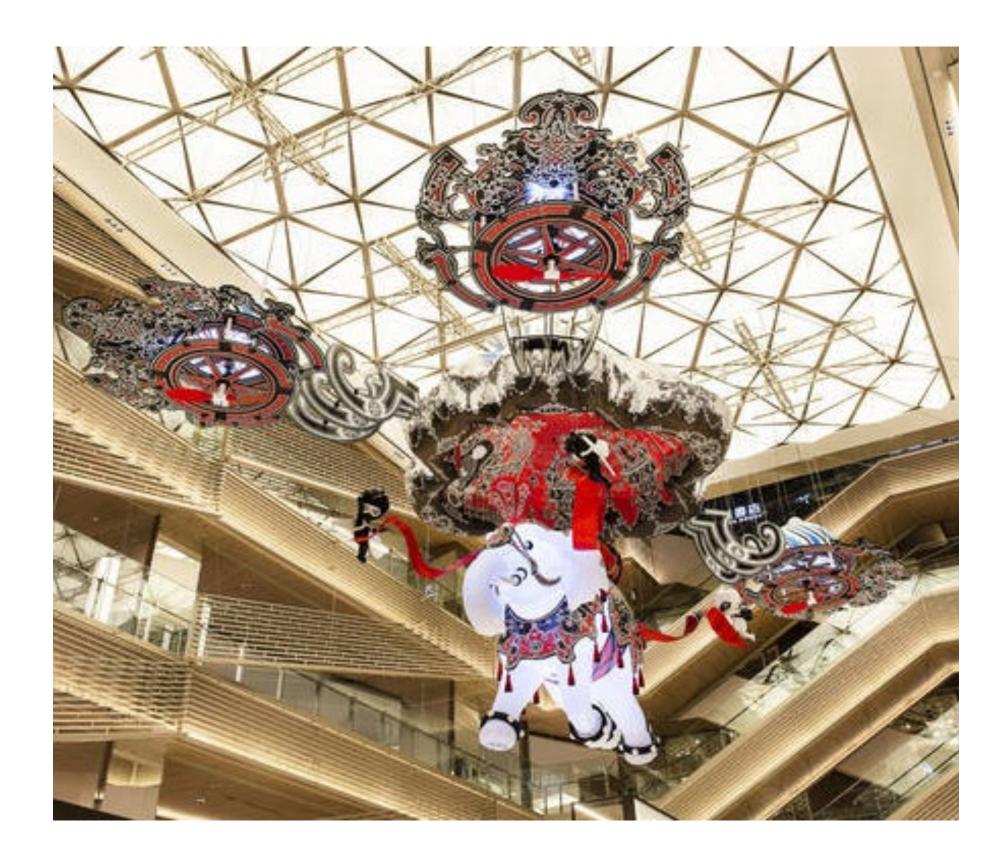

Since founding her eponymous practice in 2006, Frida Escobedo has developed a distinctive approach driven by the conviction that architecture and design represent, above all, a crucial means to interrogate and comment on social, economic, and political phenomena. In this formulation, art, both contemporary and historical, serves as an indispensable touchstone. Defying the traditional boundaries of the architectural discipline, the studio's creative output operates at a wide array of scales and mediums, encompassing buildings and experimental preservation projects, temporary installations and public sculpture, limited edition objects, publications and exhibition designs. 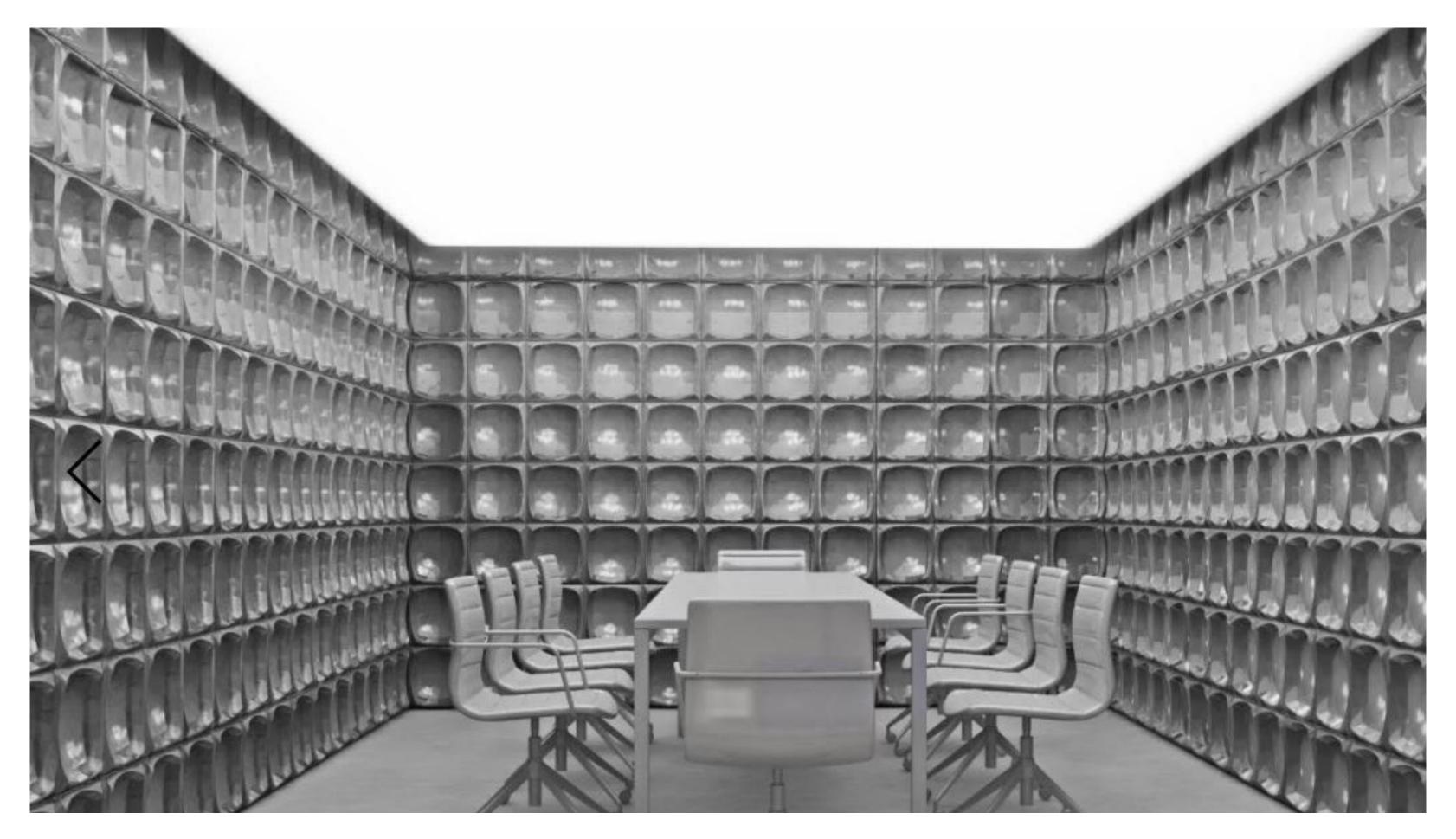
#### PROFILE:
