Casey Anthony called police after fight at a Florida bar. It involved a guy and liquid

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Casey Anthony is in the news again, and not for the right reasons.

The infamous Florida woman — acquitted of murdering her 2-year-old daughter Caylee a decade ago in Orlando — had a bust-up with another woman at West Palm Beach bar O'Shea's Irish Pub and called cops.

In a 911 call first published by TMZ, the 35-year-old tells the dispatcher that her rival, later identified as Thelma Moya, harassed her over a longtime beef.

"It was a repeated incident, it was harassment, on top of the repeat of-

fense," Anthony is heard saying on the May 23 call. "It was a verbal assault outside and a thrown drink inside. I would like to make an official report."

According to an event report from West Palm Beach police, officers made contact with Anthony who alleged that Moya, while sparring over an ex-boyfriend, spilled water on her left leg.

The so-called Tot Mom said she only wanted the incident documented in case she wanted to file a restraining order down the road.

Moya later told Fox News that the altercation had "zero to do with an ex-boyfriend. There's more to it I wish to not

say."

No arrests were made.

Bodycam footage published by TMZ shows Anthony talking to an officer inside the loud bar and showing the liquid thrown on her; a fellow patron at the establishment backs up her story. Anthony claims that Moya was upset because they were both dating the same man, a cop, at some point.

In July 2011, Anthony, an Ohio native who now calls South Florida home, was sentenced to four years for lying to the police, but was released weeks later for time served.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 142, "ZONING DISTRICTS AND REGULATIONS," ARTICLE II, "DISTRICT REGULATIONS," AT DIVISION 5, "CD-2 COMMERCIAL, MEDIUM INTENSITY DISTRICT," (1) BY AMENDING SECTION 142-305, "PROHIBITED USES," TO PROHIBIT HOTELS, APARTMENT HOTELS AND SUITE HOTELS IN THE SUNSET HARBOUR AREA; AND (2) BY ESTABLISHING SECTION 142-312, "SUNSET HARBOUR DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS," AND BY AMENDING DIVISION 11, "L-1 LIGHT INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT," BY ESTABLISHING SECTION 142-489, "SUNSET HARBOUR DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS," TO MODIFY HEIGHT LIMITS, HEIGHT EXCEPTIONS, AND REGULATIONS FOR SPECIAL EVENTS AND OUTDOOR SPEAKERS, ESTABLISH LIMITATIONS FOR LOT SIZE AND LOT AGGREGATION, MODIFY REQUIREMENTS FOR CLEAR PEDESTRIAN PATHS, AND ESTABLISH LIMITATIONS FOR ESTABLISHMENTS OVER 25,000 SQUARE FEET IN THE SUNSET HARBOUR NEIGHBORHOOD; AND (3) BY AMENDING CHAPTER 130, "OFF-STREET PARKING," ARTICLE II, "DISTRICTS; REQUIREMENTS," AT SECTION 133-33, "OFF-STREET PARKING REQUIREMENTS FOR PARKING DISTRICTS NOS. 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, AND 9," TO MODIFY PARKING REQUIREMENTS FOR NON-RESIDENTIAL USES ABOVE THE GROUND FLOOR IN PARKING DISTRICT NUMBER 5; AND PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION, REPEALER, SEVERABILITY, APPLICABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE. *This Ordinance is being heard pursuant to Section 118-164 of the City's Land Development Code.
