A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA, APPROVING THE FUNDING OF THE STOP-THE-BLEED KITS FOR MIAMI BEACH NAUTILUS MIDDLE SCHOOL, MIAMI BEACH SOUTH POINTE ELEMENTARY, MIAMI BEACH FIENBERG FISHER K-8, NORTH BEACH ELEMENTARY, BISCAYNE BEACH ELEMENTARY, AND TREASURE ISLAND ELEMENTARY, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$37,000.00, SUBJECT TO THE CITY COMMISSION APPROPRIATING THE FUNDS; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH MIAMI-DADE COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS REGARDING THE INSTALLATION, MAINTENANCE OF THE KITS, AND STAFF TRAINING; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ACCEPT DONATIONS FROM THE MAKE OUR SCHOOLS SAFE ORGANIZATION, AND FROM MIAMI-DADE COUNTY SCHOOL BOARD MEMBER LUCIA BAEZ-GELLER, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$15,000.00, AND \$2,000.00, RESPECTIVELY, FOR THE PURCHASE OF THE STOP-THE-BLEED KITS, AND TO MAKE ANY NECESSARY EXPENDITURES OF THE DONATIONS IN FURTHERANCE OF, AND CONSISTENT WITH, THE PURPOSE SET FORTH HEREIN; AND FURTHER, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO NEGOTIATE AND EXECUTE ANY AGREEMENTS NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE THE STOP-THE-BLEED KITS INSTALLATION.

WHEREAS, at the July 23, 2021 Finance and Economic Resiliency Committee, a motion was made to support the funding of Stop-the-Bleed Kits in Miami Beach public schools at a cost of \$37,500 plus shipping; and

WHEREAS, at the request and urging of the Miami Beach Senior High School Parent Teacher Student Association (PTSA), in early 2021, approximately 137 Stop-The-Bleed kits and wall mounts were installed at Miami Beach Senior High School; and

WHEREAS, according to PTSA, the funds for the May 2021 installation of the 137 kits, worth approximately \$15,000, were provided as follows: \$5,000 PTSA; \$6,000 Make Our Schools Safe; \$4,200 Dr. Martin Karp, School Board Member; and

WHEREAS, the kits were purchased from iThrive Medical, a vendor approved by Miami-Dade County; each kit containing standard first aid supplies including scissors, gauze, gloves, bandages, a tourniquet, and a chest seal with easy to read and understand instructions, at a cost of approximately \$62.50 for each kit, and \$45.00 for wall mounts, plus shipping; and

WHEREAS, training for school staff to use the kits was arranged by Miami-Dade County Public Schools ("MDPS"), and administered from Jackson Memorial Health Ryder Trauma Center staff; and

WHEREAS, per emails from Miami-Dade County School Board member Lucia Baez-Geller, and Miami Beach Senior High School PTSA, the installation of the Stop-

The-Bleed kits at each Miami Beach public school would include the following total number of classrooms and common areas: Biscayne Beach Elementary, 55; North Beach Elementary, 69; Miami Beach South Pointe Elementary, 44; Miami Beach Fienberg Fisher K8, 70; Miami Beach Nautilus Middle School, 74; Treasure Island Elementary, 37; for a total of 349 kits; and

WHEREAS, City administration obtained required quotes from various vendors and selected iThrive to provide up to 349 Essential Bleeding Control Kits (Stop-the-Bleed Kits) and associated training for 350 public school teachers and staff at a cost of \$36,017.93; and

WHEREAS, each Essential Bleeding Control Kit includes the following: 2x Pair Large Nitrile Gloves; 1x Trauma Shears; 1x CAT Tourniquet; 1x Permanent Marker; 1x Sterile Krinkle Gauze; 1x Israeli Compression Bandage; 2x Hyfin Chest Seals; 1x Emergency Blanket; and 1x Stop-the-Bleed Instruction Card; and

WHEREAS, Make Our School Safe, a 501(c)(3) dedicated to protecting students and teachers at school and the organization, has committed to a donation in the amount of \$15,000.00 to support the City's efforts to provide the Stop-the-Bleed Kits in Miami Beach public schools, with a portion of these funds to be used to purchase banners for each of the partner schools to promote this initiative; and

WHEREAS, Miami-Dade County School Board member Lucia Baez-Geller has committed to an individual donation in the amount of \$2,000 for the purchase of the Stop-the-Bleed-Kits; and

WHEREAS, MDCPS has indicated that their partnership would include the following: installation of the wall-mounted kits at each school done by school maintenance; blood Pathogen Training for teachers and staff; inoculations for teachers and staff; annual maintenance of the kits, training for staff, and inoculations for staff; placement of banners promoting the partnership with the City of Miami Beach and Make Our Schools Safe Organization at each public school; and placement of Make Our Schools Safe Organization logo, and/or City of Miami Beach logo hyperlinked to applicable websites.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT DULY RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA that the Mayor and City Commission hereby approve the funding of the Stop-The-Bleed kits for Miami Beach Nautilus Middle School, Miami Beach South Pointe Elementary, Miami Beach Fienberg Fisher K-8, North Beach Elementary, Biscayne Beach Elementary, and Treasure Island Elementary, in an amount not to exceed \$37,000.00, subject to the City Commission appropriating the funds; authorize the City Manager to execute a Memorandum of Understanding with Miami-Dade County Public Schools regarding the installation, and maintenance of the kits, and staff training; authorize the City Manager to accept donations from the Make Our Schools Safe organization, and from Miami-Dade County School Board Member Lucia Baez-Geller, in the amount of \$15,000.00, and \$2,000.00, respectively, for the purchase of the Stop-The-Bleed kits, and to make any necessary expenditures of the donations in furtherance of, and consistent with, the purpose set forth

herein; and further, authorize the City Manager to negotiate and execute any agreements necessary to effectuate the Stop-The-Bleed kits installation.
