A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA, ACCEPTING THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE FINANCE AND ECONOMIC RESILIENCY COMMITTEE TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE MIAMI BEACH SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL ROCK ENSEMBLE AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAM, THROUGH A GRANT TO YOUNG MUSICIANS UNITE, INC FOR THE 2021-22 SCHOOL YEAR, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$30,000; AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER AND CITY CLERK TO EXECUTE A GRANT AGREEMENT WITH YOUNG MUSICIANS UNITE, INC, RETROACTIVE TO THE BEGINNING OF THE 2021-2022 SCHOOL YEAR (AUGUST 23, 2021); AND FURTHER AUTHORIZING FUNDING FOR SUBSEQUENT SCHOOL YEARS, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$30,000 PER FISCAL YEAR, SUBJECT TO FUNDING APPROVAL DURING THE CITY'S ANNUAL BUDGETARY PROCESS.

WHEREAS, over the past several years, the City of Miami Beach has expanded free afterschool enrichment programs at Miami Beach Fienberg Fisher K-8, Biscayne Beach Elementary, and Miami Beach Senior High School to support various components of the Miami Beach Education Compact ("Education Compact"); and

WHEREAS, the Education Compact reflects the desire of the Miami Beach community to support excellence in education in the City's public schools and is an investment in the overall enhancement of education for the City's residents; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the City's Education Compact with Miami-Dade County Public Schools, the City has expanded free afterschool school enrichment at select public schools in order to expand educational opportunities for Miami Beach youth; and

WHEREAS, on October 16, 2019, the Mayor and Cities Commission adopted Resolution No. 2019-31014, amending Resolution No. 2018-30259, adding the Rock Ensemble program as part of the afterschool enrichment program offerings at Miami Beach Senior High School, at a cost of \$10,000 for the 2019-2020 school year; and

WHEREAS, on January 13, 2021, the Mayor and City Commission adopted Resolution No. 2021-31537, approving donations for afterschool performances by the Miami Beach Senior High School Rock Ensemble ("Miami Beach Rock Ensemble") program; said donations would be received by the City of Miami Beach to support the needs of the Miami Beach Rock Ensemble program, which would include, without limitation, musical equipment, uniforms, competition registration fees, and transportation needs of the Miami Beach Rock Ensemble afterschool youth participants each year; and

WHEREAS, at the October 13, 2021 City Commission meeting, item C4 R was referred to the Finance and Economic Resiliency Committee for discussion, to provide matching funds in an amount not to exceed \$30,000 for the Miami Beach Ensemble program, through Young Musicians Unite, Inc., for the 2021-22 school year; and

WHEREAS, at the February 25, 2022 Finance and Economic Resiliency Committee meeting, members unanimously supported the funding of the Miami Beach Rock Ensemble program, through a grant to Young Musicians Unite, Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$30,000 for the 2021-22 school year and each year thereafter, subject to funding approval during the City's annual budgeting process; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager recommends that the Mayor and City Commission accept the recommendation of the Finance and Economic Resiliency Committee to approve the funding for the Miami Beach Rock Ensemble program, in the amount not to exceed \$30,000 for the 2021-2022 school year, as well as funding for subsequent school years, in an amount not to exceed \$30,000 per fiscal year, subject to funding approval during the City's annual budgetary process; and further recommends that the funding for the 2021-2022 school year become effective retroactively as of the beginning of the 2021-2022 school year (August 23, 2021).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT DULY RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA, that the Mayor and City Commission hereby accept the recommendation of the Finance and Economic Resiliency Committee to provide funding for the Miami Beach Senior High School Rock Ensemble afterschool program, through a grant to Young Musicians Unite, Inc. for the 2021-22 school year, in an amount not to exceed \$30,000; and authorize the City Manager and City Clerk to execute a grant agreement for the 2021-22 school year, retroactive to the beginning of the school year (August 23, 2021); and further authorize funding for subsequent school years, in an amount not to exceed \$30,000 per fiscal year, subject to funding approval during the City's annual budgetary process.
