Data presented here are from Merlin, Florida's web-based reportable disease surveillance system. Data in this report are aggregated by the date the case was reported to the Bureau of Epidemiology, Florida Department of Health. Cases are assigned to Florida counties based on the county of residence at the time of the disease identification, regardless of where they became ill or were hospitalized, diagnosed, or exposed. Disease reporting is an ongoing process. Numbers displayed are preliminary and will fluctuate up or down over time as case reports undergo further investigation and validation. Counts include confirmed and probable cases. Summaries of reportable disease data are produced weekly, monthly, and annually and are located on the Bureau of Epidemiology's <u>Data and Publication page</u>.
