- SUBJECT: A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA CALLING FOR A NOVEMBER 8, 2022 CITY OF MIAMI BEACH SPECIAL ELECTION, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE ELECTORATE OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH A QUESTION ASKING WHETHER CITY CHARTER SECTION 2.07(a) REGARDING VACANCIES ON CITY COMMISSION NOT DUE TO RESIGNATION SHOULD BE AMENDED TO REQUIRE AN ELECTION, INCLUDING FOR EXISTING VACANCIES, IF COMMISSION IS UNABLE TO DECIDE WHETHER TO FILL VACANCIES BY APPOINTMENT OR ELECTION, OR HAS DECIDED TO APPOINT TO FILL A VACANCY AND FAILS TO MAKE AN APPOINTMENT, WITH SUCH ELECTION TO BE HELD AT THE NEXT AVAILABLE CITY GENERAL ELECTION, UNLESS MAJORITY OF REMAINING COMMISSION MEMBERS CALL AN ELECTION ON EARLIER AVAILABLE ELECTION DATE.

At the request of Commissioner David Richardson, the sponsor of this Resolution, the proposed ballot question and accompanying charter amendment have been modified to make clear that the Charter amendment, if approved, would apply to any *existing* and future vacancy on the City Commission.

Accordingly, the attached Resolution has been prepared calling for a City of Miami Beach Special Election to be held on November 8, 2022 for the purpose of submitting to the City's voters the following question: Commission Memorandum – Amend Charter Section 2.07(a) July 20, 2022 Page 2

Amend Charter Section 2.07(a) Regarding Election to Fill City Commission Vacancies (Not Due to Resignation)

Shall Charter Section 2.07(a), regarding vacancies on City Commission (not due to resignation), be amended to require, including for existing vacancies:

- an election if Commission fails to decide whether to fill vacancies by appointment or election, or has decided to appoint to fill a vacancy and fails to make an appointment, with
- such election held at next available City General Election, unless majority of remaining Commission members call an election on earlier available election date?

PROPOSED AMENDED CITY CHARTER TEXT

Sec. 2.07. Vacancies in City Commission.

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Any vacancy occurring in the City Commission shall be filled as follows:

(a) Vacancy for reasons other than resignation. The City Commission shall, within 30 days after the vacancy occurs, decide whether to fill said vacancy by City election or by Commission appointment. Should the Commission choose to appoint, said action shall be taken by vote of the majority of the remaining members of the City Commission within 30 days after the expiration of the above subject initial 30-day period, with the appointee serving the remainder of the unexpired term until the next succeeding General City Election and with any further remainder of said unexpired term to be filled by a Commission member elected at said General Election. If the members of the City Commission shall choose instead to fill such vacancy by election, then a Special Election shall be called to be held within 90 days after the expiration of the subject 30-day period to elect a Commission member to fill such vacancy for the remainder of the unexpired term. If the City Commission fails to decide on any vacancy, including any vacancy existing as of November 8, 2022, whether to fill the vacancy by appointment or election, or has decided to fill the vacancy by appointment but fails to make such appointment, the vacancy shall be filled thereafter at the next available General City Election, unless a majority of the remaining members of the Commission choose to call the election to be held at an earlier available City Special Election or County wide Election, with the person elected to fill such vacancy for the remainder of the unexpired term.

The Miami-Dade County Elections Department has informed the City Clerk that the City's Resolution calling a November 8, 2022 Special Election must be provided to the County Elections Department by July 29, 2022. Accordingly, it should be noted that although

today's Commission meeting is the last regularly-scheduled meeting of the City Commission at which a Resolution may be adopted placing a ballot question on the City's November 8, 2022 Special Election ballot, the Commission may place this matter on its July 25, 2022 special-set Commission meeting agenda for its consideration of approval for ballot placement on the November 8, 2022 ballot.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT

The Miami-Dade County Elections Department has provided the City Clerk with an estimate of approximately \$28,559.85 (Cost Estimate for One Page Ballot) and \$56,217.70 (Cost Estimate in the Scenario Multiple Questions Triggers an Additional Page) to conduct the November 8, 2022 Special Election, which includes the costs associated with 14 days of Early Voting. (See Department of Election Estimates.) Additionally, the City will incur approximately \$42,000 in legally mandated advertisements, required by the Florida Statutes and the City Code, to notice this Special Election.
