SUBJECT:

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH. FLORIDA CALLING FOR A NOVEMBER 8. 2022 CITY OF MIAMI BEACH SPECIAL ELECTION, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE ELECTORATE OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH A QUESTION ASKING WHETHER. IF VOTERS APPROVE THE LEASES OF CITY-OWNED SURFACE PARKING LOTS WITH 1664 MERIDIAN, LLC AND/OR LINCOLN ROAD PROPERTY OWNER, LP TO DIVERSIFY THE LINCOLN ROAD CORRIDOR WITH ADDITIONAL CLASS-A OFFICE PROJECTS. CITY SHOULD DEDICATE THE GUARANTEED RENT PAYMENTS RECEIVED BY CITY UNDER THE LEASES, TOTALING UP TO \$355,793,085, IN EQUAL PORTIONS, SOLELY FOR THE FOLLOWING PUBLIC PURPOSES: RESILIENCY SUSTAINABILITY **INFRASTRUCTURE** AND INITIATIVES. WORKFORCE HOUSING, AND PUBLIC SAFETY AND CRIME PREVENTION MEASURES.

At the request of Commissioner Richardson, the sponsor of this item, the attached Resolution has been prepared calling for a City of Miami Beach Special Election to be held on November 8, 2022 for the purpose of submitting to the City's voters the following question:

Approval of Use of Rent Payments Received by City from Lincoln Road Parking Lot Leases

If voters approve the leases of City-owned surface parking lots with 1664 Meridian, LLC and/or Lincoln Road Property Owner, LP to diversify the Lincoln Road corridor with additional Class-A office projects, shall City dedicate the guaranteed rent payments received by City under the leases, totaling up to \$355,793,085, in equal portions, solely for the following public purposes:

- Resiliency and Sustainability Infrastructure Initiatives,
- Workforce Housing, and
- Public Safety and Crime Prevention Measures?

The companion agenda items related to the Lincoln Road Parking Lot projects shall be considered at the July 20, 2022 City Commission meeting, including approval, on second reading, of the leases and development agreements for the subject properties, and approval of the Resolutions calling for a special election for the purpose of submitting to the voters ballot questions regarding approval of the leases as required by Section 1.03(b)(2) of the City Charter.

The Miami-Dade County Elections Department has informed the City Clerk that the City's Resolution calling a November 8, 2022 Special Election must be provided to the County Elections Department by July 29, 2022. Accordingly, it should be noted that the proposed measure may be considered by the City Commission either at the July 20, 2022 City Commission meeting or, at the latest, the Special Meeting scheduled for July 25, 2022.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT

The Miami-Dade County Elections Department has provided the City Clerk with an estimate of approximately \$28,559.85 (Cost Estimate for One Page Ballot) and \$56,217.70 (Cost Estimate in the Scenario Multiple Questions Triggers an Additional Page) to conduct the November 8, 2022 Special Election, which includes the costs associated with 14 days of Early Voting. (See Department of Election Estimates.) Additionally, the City will incur approximately \$42,000 in legally mandated advertisements, required by the Florida Statutes and the City Code, to notice this Special Election.
