- Concepts coordinated with City departments and approved by FERC
- Tactical urbanism scope analyzed and reduced to defer Drexel Avenue component until a feasible strategy to mitigate parking impacts is identified
- Received direction from FERC to use the allocated \$200K budget on Tactical Urbanism improvements for:
 - Española Way West from Pennsylvania to Drexel avenues
 - Española Way East from Washington to Collins avenues
 - 14th Court alleyway from Collins Avenue to Ocean Drive
- New traffic data collected to reflect current Washington Ave configuration
- Revised traffic study submitted to County for review



Tactical Urbanism project with painted asphalt and creation of usable social space within the re-purposed travel lanes.


