<u>Agreement No.</u> ITB 2018-080-ND	<u>Title</u> Routine and Emergency Sanitary Sewer and Storm Water Pipes Cleaning and Close Circuit Television (CCTV) Inspection Services
<u>Contractor</u> Flotech Environmental, LLC	<u>Current Term</u> through 10/3/2023
<u>Brief Scope:</u> The purpose of this Agreement is to provide routine and emergency sanitary sewer and stormwater pipe cleaning and CCTV inspection services.	
<u>Request:</u> This item seeks approval from the Mayor and City Commission to amend the Agreement to include the language required by federal agencies when the City seeks reimbursement for services, typically in response to an emergency. The items also seeks authorization for the City Manager to execute Amendment No. 1 pursuant to Section "O," "Amendments," of the Agreement.	
<u>Estimated Fiscal Impact:</u> This Amendment does not have a fiscal impact. Expenditures are subject to funds availability approved through the City's budgeting process.	
<u>Justification:</u> On October 4, 2018, the City executed an Agreement with Flotech Environmental, LLC, pursuant to ITB 2018-080-ND, for routine and emergency sanitary sewer and stormwater pipes cleaning and closed-circuit television (CCTV) inspection services. Since then, several federal agencies, including FEMA, have amended the requirements that need to be included in local government contracts for services for which reimbursement may be sought. Accordingly, the City of Miami Beach has drafted an amendment to incorporate the required language, including "Contract Provisions for Non-Federal Entity Contracts Under Federal Awards," "Byrd Anti-Lobbying Amendment Certification," "Suspension and Debarment Certification," and other miscellaneous requirements as detailed in the attached amendment. This Amendment is required to ensure the City receives full reimbursement of any eligible expense relating to hurricanes or other disasters.
