A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA, ESTABLISHING, PURSUANT THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE то POLICE/CITIZENS RELATIONS COMMITTEE, AN "AD HOC SPRING BREAK TASK FORCE ADVISORY COMMITTEE." FOR A PERIOD OF ONE YEAR (SUBJECT TO EARLIER OR LATER SUNSET BY THE CITY COMMISSION) TO ADVISE THE ADMINISTRATION AND CITY COMMISSION ON THE UPCOMING MARCH 2024 SPRING BREAK PERIOD, AND TO PROVIDE A FORUM TO ADDRESS QUALITY OF LIFE AND PUBLIC SAFETY AFFECTING OUR RESIDENTS AND BUSINESS ISSUES OWNERS DURING EVERY SPRING BREAK PERIOD: AND PRESCRIBING THE PURPOSE, COMPOSITION, POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE COMMITTEE.

WHEREAS, the City of Miami Beach (the "City") is an internationally renowned touris stination that is famous for its beautiful beaches, world-class shopping, entertainment, fine ning, and vast array of artistic and cultural events; and

WHEREAS, in recent years, the City has seen an increasingly large number of visitors ring the Spring Break period, which has posed significant challenges including, but not limited to treme traffic and congestion, and severe impacts to the City's Police, Fire, Sanitation, and Code empliance services; and

WHEREAS, many of the visitors to the City during high impact periods, such as Spring eak, are under the influence of alcoholic beverages and have demonstrated a blatant disregard - the rule of law; and

WHEREAS, in 2021, unruly crowd control issues during Spring Break resulted in the position of emergency measures, including an 8:00 pm. curfew in the area between 5<sup>th</sup> Street d 16<sup>th</sup> Street, from Pennsylvania Avenue to Ocean Drive; and

WHEREAS, in March 2022, the City also experienced massive crowds and severa ootings in a concentrated tourist area over a period of a few days, resulting in the declaration o state of emergency and imposition of a weekend curfew for the last weekend of March, 2022 d

WHEREAS, in March 2023, there were multiple fights, shootings, and various othe cidents and police calls for service—for example, for the period between February 27, 2023 and arch 18, 2023, there have been four (4) aggravated assault arrests, three (3) aggravated battery rests, seven (7) robbery arrests, twenty (20) arrests for carrying a concealed firearm, thirty-sever 7) felony drug arrests, twelve (12) arrests for battery on a law enforcement officer, and eighty-two 2) arrests for other felonies; and

WHEREAS, at its April 25, 2023 meeting, the City's Police/Citizen Relations Committee animously passed a motion recommending the establishment of a Task Force Committee garding Spring Break 2024, by no later than June 1, 2023, with proposed recommendations to be ibmitted to the Mayor and City Commission by the end of summer 2023, in order to ensure that is collaborative message is heard as the City Administration moves into the planning stages fo pring Break 2024; and

WHEREAS, there is a clear pattern of unruly crowds, general mayhem, and violence that kes place in the City during every Spring Break season; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission desire for the City to be proactive ir eventing mayhem, violence, and unruly crowds that have statistically occurred in the City during ich March Spring Break period; and

WHEREAS, it would be of benefit for the City to establish an Ad Hoc Spring Break Tasl prce Advisory Committee to advise the Administration and City Commission on public safety sues affecting the City during every Spring Break season, and to provide a forum to address ality of life issues affecting our residents and business owners; and

WHEREAS, the purpose, composition, powers and duties of the Committee members, and administrative liaison to the Committee, are set forth in Exhibit "A" attached hereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF IE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA, that the Mayor and City Commission hereby establish irsuant to the recommendation of the Police/Citizens Relations Committee, an "Ad Hoc Spring eak Task Force Advisory Committee," for a period of one year (subject to earlier or later sunse the City Commission) to advise the Administration and City Commission on the upcoming March 24 Spring Break period, and to provide a forum to address quality of life and public safety issues ecting our residents and business owners during every Spring Break period; and prescribe the rpose, composition, powers and duties of the Committee.

## EXHIBIT "A"

#### d Hoc Spring Break Task Force Advisory Committee

### A. Purpose

- The Ad Hoc Spring Break Task Force Advisory Committee ("Spring Break Task Force") will review, formulate and coordinate information, proposals and issues raised by the City Manager, the Mayor, members of the City Commission, the residents, businesses, and other concerned citizens. The Task Force will prepare recommendations on how to improve the City's response to unruly crowds and mayhem brought by every Spring Break period.
- 2. The Spring Break Task Force will address the needs and concerns of the residents and businesses by making recommendations on issues affecting the relationship between the City and Spring Break, while maintaining a balanced perspective as to quality of life issues affecting both residents and businesses.
- 3. The Spring Break Task Force will meet on a monthly basis, or as frequent as the Tasl Force deems necessary to make a final recommendation. The Task Force will sunset at the end of 12 months unless determined by the Mayor and City Commission that it should be extended.

#### B. Membership Composition

- 1. The Spring Break Task Force shall be composed of nine (9) members, with seven (7) direc appointments made by individual city commissioners and the mayor, and two (2) at-large appointments, all of whom shall be appointed to serve for a term of no more than one (1 year at a time.
  - A. The seven (7) direct appointments must be residents of the City for a minimum of two (2) years and reside south of 23<sup>rd</sup> Street. Exceptions to the foregoing may be approved by a majority vote of the City Commission.
  - B. One at-large appointee must be a representative from the hotel industry operating of Ocean Drive, and the second at-large appointee must be a representative from a restaurant operating on Ocean Drive. Exceptions to the foregoing may be approved by a majority vote of the City Commission for individuals with specific knowledge o expertise relative to the hospitality industry.

## C. Powers and Duties

e Spring Break Task Force will serve to advise the City Manager on Spring Break issues and to ovide a forum to address quality of life issues affecting our residents and businesses, as a resul the City's popularity.

- 1. The Spring Break Task Force's charge and scope of work should include, but not be limited to:
  - a. Serve in an advisory capacity to the City Manager with respect to public safet matters pertaining to upcoming Spring Break 2024 and its impact on the quality o life of our City.
  - b. Make recommendations as to the needs and concerns of the public and the businesses in the City, including how those needs can best be met.

c. Focus on, and make recommendations regarding, proposed Spring Break harn reduction initiatives.

# D. Conflict of interest.

accordance with Florida law, under circumstances presenting a conflict of interest, an advison and member should abstain from voting with respect to any measure in which the advisory board ember has a personal, private, or professional interest and which inures to his special private ain or the special gain of a principal by whom he is retained. the City Attorney's Office liaison shal isist advisory board members in addressing any potential voting conflicts, as necessary.

## E. Administrative Liaison

ne supporting departments for the Spring Break Task Force shall be the City Manager's Office e Public Works Department, and the Police Department. The City Attorney's Office shall provide gal counsel to the Spring Break Task Force.
