In the event the applicable development review board determines that the foregoing disclosure requirement was not timely satisfied by the person or entity requesting approval, relief or other action as provided above, then the application or order, as applicable, shall immediately be deemed null and void without further force or effect, and no application from said person or entity for the subject property shall be reviewed or considered by the applicable board(s) until expiration of a period of one year after the nullification of the application or order. It shall be unlawful to employ any device, scheme or artifice to circumvent the disclosure requirements of this section and such circumvention shall be deemed a violation of the disclosure requirements of this section.

When the applicable Boards reach a decision, a Final Order will be issued stating the Board's decision and any conditions imposed therein. This is a letter of intent with details regarding the proposed application request to the Design Review Board.

The City of Miami Beach Art in Public Places program has been an important part of the cultural landscape in Miami Beach for more than 20 years. Currently, the program is in the process of commissioning six (6) internationally recognized artists for the Miami Beach Convention Center Renovation and Expansion project, with an estimated public art contribution of \$7,000,000. The proposed works by these artists exemplify Miami Beach's prestigious commitment to commission world class works of public art. The commissioning of these public art works elevates the public art program to a whole new level.

The Art in Public Places Office issued an international call to artists or artist teams to create public art for the Miami Beach Convention Center renovation and expansion project in January 2015, over five hundred artists from around the world submitted qualifications for consideration.

After a competitive and rigorous selection process, the Miami Beach Art in Public Places Committee recommended the following internationally renowned artists to create site specific, integrated works of public art for the Miami Beach Convention Center Project: Franz Ackermann (Berlin), Elmgreen & Dragset (Berlin), Ellen Harvey (Brooklyn), Joseph Kosuth (London/New York), Sarah Morris (New York) and Joep Van Lieshout (Ravenstein, The Netherlands).

Highly integrated, complex designs, these monumental works of public art will be located throughout the new convention center. Joseph Kosuth is creating *Located World, Miami Beach*, a neon and text installation for the main lobby that shows Miami Beach as the center of the world. Elmgreen and Dragset will mark the greenspace at the west entrance with *Bent Pool*, a sculpture that turns a swimming pool into a monumental arch. The grand ballroom will feature Ellen Harvey's *Waterways*, a series of glass panels that reference Miami Beach's unique connection to the many bodies of water that nourish the larger Florida ecosystem. Sarah Morris will design the exterior walls of the northeast entranceway with *Sans Souci*, a large-scale tile installation that references Morris Lapidus' first Miami Beach architectural work in 1949. Franz Ackermann will adorn the southeast corner of the center with a dynamic mural emblematic of Miami Beach's international tourism, globalization and urbanism. Joep Van Lieshout will create

an installation of *Humanoids*, a series of sculptures for the northeast ballroom park that draw inspiration from nature and the roots of mankind.

FRANZ ACKERMANN

Franz Ackermann was born in 1963 in Neumarkt St. Veit, Germany. He studied at Akademie der Bildenden Künste, Munich (1984-88) and at Hochschule für Bildende Kunst, Hamburg (1989-91). He holds a professorship of Fine Arts at the Academy of Fine Arts Karlsruhe (since 2001). Ackermann has participated in numerous international solo exhibitions including Kunsthalle Karlsruhe, Karlsruhe (2014); Berlinische Galerie, Berlin, (2013); Faena Arts Center, Buenos Aires, (2012); Kunstmuseum Bonn, Bonn, (2009); Kunstmuseum St. Gallen, St. Gallen, (2009); Irish Museum of Modern Art, Dublin, (2005); Museum of Contemporary Art, Chicago, (2002); Stedelijk Museum, Amsterdam, (2002); Portikus, Frankfurt, (1997). ELMGREEN & DRAGSET

Michael Elmgreen (b. 1961, Copenhagen) and Ingar Dragset (b. 1969, Trondheim) are based in Berlin and have worked together as an artist duo since 1995. They have held solo exhibitions worldwide, including at PLATEAU, Samsung Museum of Art, Seoul; National Gallery of Denmark, Copenhagen; Astrup Fearnley Museet, Oslo; Victoria and Albert Museum, London; Museum Boijmans van Beuningen, Rotterdam; ZKM Museum of Modern Art, Karlsruhe; MUSAC, León; The Power Plant, Toronto; Serpentine Gallery, London; Tate Modern, London; and Kunsthalle Zürich. They have participated in the Liverpool, Singapore, Moscow, Gwangju, São Paulo, Istanbul, and Berlin biennials and received a special mention for their exhibition "The Collectors", Nordic and Danish Pavilions, 53rd Venice Biennale (2009). In 2015 the Instituto Superior de Arte, at the University of Havana, awarded him a Honoris Causa doctorate. Van Lieshout's international solo exhibitions, include La Friche le Belle de Mai, Marseille (2013); Mumok, Vienna (2010); Winzavod, Moscow (2009); Museum Folkwang, Essen (2008); Hayward Gallery, London (2007); Central del Arte, Guadalajara (2006); Kröller-Müller Museum, Otterlo (2005); MACRO, Rome (2005); Camden Arts Centre, London (2002); PS1, New York (2001); Museum of Contemporary Art, Miami (1999); USF Contemporary Art Museum, Tampa (1999); The Contemporary Arts Center, Cincinnati (1999); Walker Arts Center, Minneapolis (1998); Museum für Gegenwartskunst, Zürich (1995).
