<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Whenever overhead utilities are relocated underground, regardless of how the project is funded, individual property owners are responsible for coordinating and paying to connect their properties to the underground utilities.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> A special assessment is a charge assessed against a property because that property derives some special benefit from the expenditure of the money, which benefit is (1) public and not private, and (2) special to the property rather than general to the community.
