



Mayor Gelber and City Commissioners:

This letter is to express my interest in filling the vacancy for the above position through November, 2019. I would like to thank you for taking the time to review my application and resume and consider me for this important post.

I have been a resident of Miami Beach intermittently since childhood – I remember the old Roney Plaza, the Embers Restaurant and the dog track, I attended Treasure Island Elementary, North Beach and Nautilus. While I moved away for a while after attending undergraduate and medical school at The University of Miami, I have been a resident of Miami Beach for the past 23 years. I served as the Chairman of Emergency medicine at Mount Sinai from 1990-2005 and subsequently Jackson Memorial Hospital before serving as VP and Global Chief Medical Officer for Royal Caribbean Cruise Lines for 8 years. There, I was in charge of Public Health for 40 ships as well as the medical care for 5 million annual guests and 50,000 crew.

I am now working part time at Jackson Memorial Hospital in the Emergency Department, teaching future Emergency Physicians, as well as doing consulting in the area of risk and claims management for emergency physicians across the country. This schedule gives me the opportunity to give back to the community – something my intense work schedule has not permitted in the past – I do everything all or none.

As past president of the Florida College of Emergency Physicians, I have had the opportunity to work with legislators and speak in Tallahassee, even serving as Doctor of the Day courtesy of Mayor Gelber when he was a legislator. I have run businesses and I function in the highly regulated healthcare sector. I am on the Board of Directors of Make A Wish South Florida, so I also understand non profits.

I believe a physician with a healthcare perspective and knowledge of public health issues important to our general public and business establishments would benefit the City, as well as our great employees and public servants. I know the City well and I am aware that the major issues are not directly health related but affect us all – traffic, safety and security, water and drainage, long term planning and distribution of public services – but a healthy city and a healthy workforce, critical as well.

Dr. Arthur Diskin, MD, FACEP

President and CEO, Quality Medical Management, LLC (QMM)

Dr. Diskin attended college and medical school at the University of Miami. He completed his residency in Emergency Medicine at Los Angeles County Medical Center/University of Southern California. He is Board Certified by the American Board of Emergency Medicine. Dr. Diskin is a Fellow of the American College of Emergency Physicians (FACEP), Past President of the Florida College of Emergency Physicians (FCEP), former Chief of the Department of Emergency Medicine at Jackson Memorial Hospital (JMH), in Miami, Florida (2005-2008) and Chairman of the Department of Emergency Medicine at Mount Sinai Medical Center in Miami Beach (1990-2005). He is an examiner for the American Board of Emergency Medicine (ABEM) and past Chair of the Section on Cruise Ship and Maritime Medicine of the American College of Emergency Physicians. He is currently on staff at Jackson Memorial Hospital and participates as faculty in teaching emergency medicine residents. He is also clinically active with Integrated Emergency Medicine Specialists, an independent group staffing two emergency departments in Naples, Florida.

Dr. Diskin was President and principal owner of various Emergency Medicine Specialist entities from 1985-2005 providing emergency medical care for up to 200,000 patients annually in 8 different departments from Miami to West Palm Beach, including Mount Sinai Medical Center, and employing over 60 physicians and mid-level providers.

In his current role with QMRM, a division of QMM, he provides risk and claims management services to 800 emergency physicians and providers for EMPAC Risk Retention Group (RRG) and has developed risk and claims management protocols for a senior care risk retention group (RRG) — SeniorsFirst, launched in January 2017. Dr. Diskin is developing technology to combat Legionella shoreside and in the maritime environment, as well as other water related technologies through Cymatic Solutions and is maintaining his worldwide contacts in the medical and public health professions — potentially to eventually create a global healthcare delivery platform for remote facilities and organizations. He has taken and equity position in Canada Rope & Twine — a manufacturer of innovative rope products for the marine and fire-rescue industries. He consults in the maritime and healthcare industries.

He was VP and Global Chief Medical Officer for Royal Caribbean Cruise Lines from 2008-16. In this role, he was responsible for recruiting, retaining and reviewing the credentials of the ship's physicians and nurses, determining which medications and equipment to stock, developing medical evacuation and disaster management policies and advising the ships' physicians as needed. He was also responsible for the clinical management of crew medical care on the ships and in their home countries, developing worldwide networks for the delivery of medical care, management of the CareTeam, the Crew Wellness program, and all Public Health related issues including Norovirus and Legionella prevention and mitigation. He was a consultant and then Medical Director for Carnival Cruise Lines from 1990 – 2008.

Dr. Diskin resides in Miami Beach, Florida. Dr. Diskin is on the Board of Directors of Make-A-Wish Foundation South Florida. His interests include travel, skiing, scuba diving, golf and playing basketball against his 14 year old son.
