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Preliminary Remarks

The present study comprises a survey of 801-821 Lincoln Road, a contributing historic property located in the Miami Beach Architectural District. It was prepared for Terranova Corporation in anticipation of a restoration and addition Project designed by Shulman + Associates.

The proposed project comprises the restoration/reconstruction of historic facades, and a new three-story structure stretching from Meridian Avenue to Lincoln Lane North. The restoration work will reconstruct the original appearance of the building when it was completed in 1929 as the Lincoln Metropolitan Salon (and other shops). The restoration includes the original taller windows and decorative stone work. The new structure will step back from Meridan Avenue on the second floor, and from Lincoln Lane at the third floor. It includes substantial glass walls toward the north.

This study presents the building historically, based on available documentation and site verification. It includes historical imagery and the building card. A photo survey of the current condition is also included.

Historical Analysis and Imagery

Historical Outline

Contextual History:

This landmark Art Deco-style commercial building occupies the northwest corner of Lincoln Road and Meridian Avenue in Miami Beach, on the east half of Lot 1 of Block 36 in the Golf Course (Amended) Subdivision of Miami Beach. This subdivision was platted by Carl Fisher's Alton Beach Realty Company in April 1920, although Fisher had laid out and named Lincoln Road itself several years earlier as the centerpiece of his development of Miami Beach.

By the mid-1920s Lincoln Road was a hub of social activity, with an indoor tennis court, the Community Church, the Community Theater, the Lincoln Hotel, high-end shops, and several luxury automobile showrooms. These included a Packard showroom built in 1928 as part of the original Sterling Building, and a Cadillac showroom built in 1929 at the corner of Pennsylvania Avenue. To these was added the subject building, designed by architect Russell Pancoast in 1929, with its corner storefront occupied by the Dade Motor Sales Company, headed by S.A.Ryan.¹ Fortuitously located on Lincoln Road, already known as "the Fifth Avenue of the South," it was a showroom for Lincoln automobiles.

The Lincoln Motors Company had been founded by Henry and Wilfred Leland and was known for its high quality standards, producing "the finest car in motordom." At the same time, Henry Ford was known as "the master manufacturer in quantity production," producing "the best low-priced car." In February 1922, Ford took over the struggling Lincoln Company, with the stated intention that Leland's mechanical excellence should not be lost, and also adding a luxury product to the Ford line. Subsequently, Ford stepped up its marketing and stated that "the scope of the distributors will be enlarged by the appointment of dealers in the smaller cities."² No doubt the Lincoln Road showroom was part of that effort. It had its grand opening on January 2, 1930, in the wake of the stock market crash.

Specific History:

The Building Permit Card indicates that the structure originally cost \$85,000.00 and consisted of several storefronts in addition to the showroom. It extended 150' from 801 to 821 Lincoln Road, and 135' along Meridian Avenue. Pancoast's original plans of this building were not found in the Miami Beach Building Department, and only partial original plans are extant.

Four photographs of the building from circa 1930 were found in the Matlack archive at HistoryMiami (#190-10, 191-10, 197-10, and 200-10). Two show the exterior, which differs from the building's current appearance. The entrance to the auto showroom is at the corner, which is rounded and has a stepped-up parapet above the word "Lincoln" (which had a double meaning). At ground level, plate-glass windows line both the east and south elevations; above them is a

line of transom windows topped by a corresponding row of decorative bas-relief panels, probably of cast stone, that sweep around the corner.

On Meridian Avenue, north of the showroom, two double-height vertical window panels are seen, which still survive, followed by a double driveway entrance to what was originally a mechanical garage: “5000 square feet of space to take care of the service requirements of Miami Beach Lincoln owners.”³ A rooftop wall running east-to-west between the showroom and the garage still survives.

The additional storefronts facing Lincoln Road to the west of the showroom are seen in a rendering in the October 6, 1929 *Miami Herald*, as well as the photographs. These show a pointed archway with grillwork; an adjoining storefront with more bas-relief panels over transom windows; and a clay barrel-tile roof above a square storefront with cornice and three rounded storefronts. The 1931 Polk’s City Directory lists the Lincoln Rug Galleries at 811-815 Lincoln Road, adjoining Dade Motor Sales, as another tenant in the Lincoln-Meridian Building. In 1932, a shoe store, gift shop and luggage store occupied 817, 819, and 821 Lincoln Road.

Two of the Matlack photographs show interior views of the automobile showroom; “Lincoln Galleries” and “Dade Motor Sales Co.” are written on the front window and door, positively identifying the location. The intricate wooden coffered ceiling is clearly shown, which still survives intact. The floor was various-sized clay tile, and there were two lamps of frosted-glass panels suspended from the ceiling. On the north wall of the showroom, a stairway on the left side led up to mezzanine office space. To the right of the stair were three small window openings and a balconet. The stair landing and the balconet both have decorative metal railings and are supported by brackets, and all five openings have a shallow ziggurat contour at the top. At the far ends are two decoratively perforated panels opening into the office space behind. At floor level, a built-in display panel with geometric decoration occupies the space beneath the window openings. Car parts are displayed here, probably for the education of customers. An engine block is also seen mounted on the showroom floor.

Later Alterations:

In 1938, Dade Motor Sales was replaced by the Isaac Miller shoe store, and the building underwent a transformation. The Building Card documents a small “remodeling” in November 1938, and the addition of a “balcony in rear of store” in June 1939; then a \$16,000.00 remodeling designed by the original architect, Russell Pancoast, occurred over the summer of 1939.

Only one sheet of plans, split into two parts, was found for this project, on Microfilm #12661. It is not very legible and shows only the floor plan. A photograph of this new storefront, however, appears in the February 24, 1941, *Life* magazine article on Lincoln Road (p.21). The exterior was faced in white marble, with delicate convex vertical facets wrapping around the rounded

corner. "I. Miller Beautiful Shoes" was the signage above the scalloped door, which was flanked by two large, round display windows. The storefronts along Lincoln Road had knee-walls, but otherwise are obscured by large awnings.

City directories document that there were additional storefronts at 1650 through 1658 Meridian Avenue, in what had been the original garage, from 1942 to 1959. In 1960, architect Melvin Grossman designed a \$10,000.00 addition on the north side of the building (1660 Meridian Avenue) that was completed in 1962, according to the Permit Card. It measured 15 by 100 feet, running along North Lincoln Lane. The Camelot jewelry store is listed here until 1974. In approximately 1983 the Meridian Avenue stores were converted to restaurant use, and extensively remodeled in 1988. In recent years this was well-known as David's Café II. In 2012 David's was replaced by the Abuela Restaurant.


Subsequent permits issued for 801-821 Lincoln Road include a renovation in 1987, which was probably when the round display windows at the corner were removed; they are absent in a 1990 photograph in the Planning Department database. This photograph shows the corner tenant as an Italian restaurant at that time. This was followed by other restaurant entities: "Noodles of Asia," and "Suva." An interior demolition and buildout for the Ghirardelli chocolate company occurred in 2002. The corner space was remodeled as Dylan's Candy Bar in 2012.

ARCHITECT BIOGRAPHY:


Russell T. Pancoast (1899-1972) was born in Moorestown, New Jersey, but grew up in Miami Beach as the grandson of pioneer John S. Collins and the son of Thomas J. Pancoast, early Miami Beach mayor and founder of the local Chamber of Commerce. Russell Pancoast studied architecture at Cornell, then returned to Miami Beach where he worked from 1925 to about 1955. Here he designed such notable buildings as the Collins Memorial Library (now the east wing of the Bass Museum), the Surf Club, the Miami Beach Woman's Club, and the Mead Building (901 Lincoln Road). His buildings range in style from Mediterranean Revival to Art Deco and Postwar Modern.











Curtains which usually conceal auxiliary seats back of the drive have been omitted in the Lincoln touring car. Instead, scooped-out places are found for increased leg room. In the floor at the foot of the tonneau seat is a depression that also gains greater kindness and comfort for passengers.

Whether the top is up or down, this new body meets trimness and speed, refinement, security and distinction. Shatter-proof glass is used as in all Lincoln motor cars.

Marvelous blocks, accurate to one-quarter of one-millionth of an inch, will be used to explain the precision with which Lincolns are constructed. These Johnson gages, the most precise measuring instruments in the history of the world, played a large part in the standardization of the inch by the United States Bureau of Standards, and the Ford Motor Company built the blocks which the government uses. Other sets have been turned out for use all over the world.






