From 2004-2006, the Goldmans taught me about the role of placemaking, creating community with urban design, and the importance of restoring our iconic buildings as a source of pride in the Art Deco Historic District. In that role, I also had a front seat to the urban design plan that would transform Wynwood, as we repurposed warehouse structures to create Wynwood Walls & brought in an anchor neighborhood restaurant (like Joey's) in order to activate the streets with pedestrian traffic.

Complementing this on-the-ground training was a Master in Public Policy from Harvard Kennedy School, where I focused on urban development, affordable housing, & real estate. I developed my own customized program taking classes at the Harvard Design School, Harvard Business School & Harvard Kennedy School. I wrote my thesis consulting with Liz Platter-Zyberk from DPZ, the luminary architect charged with reinventing Miami's code-based plan known as Miami 21. My focus was how that code could spur private sector investment in affordable housing.




