

AUGUST GEIGER (1888-1968)

Arrived in the City of Miami in 1905 and became Florida's tenth registered architect.

Widely considered Miami Beach Developer Carl Fisher's favorite architect, he started his own practice in 1911.

He was known mainly for designing buildings in the Mediterranean style with a strong Beaux-Arts influence.

Designed many significant buildings within the City and County, such as:

- I. Bulmer Apartments, ca 1918 (Demolished)
- II. Miami City Hospital, 1918 Now the "Alamo"
- III. Van Dyke Building, 1924 Formerly Fisher Realty Offices
- IV. Carl Fisher's House, 1925 Now home of Ugo Colombo
- V. Boca Chita Lighthouse, 1938
- V. Chase Federal Bank, Lincoln Rd., 1947










Establishing Hierarchy - Distinct volmes, including a stair tower as fulcrum






Planning Scheme Proposed design

1. Historic Research & Documentation


Through rigorous research and detailed documentation, understand the architectural character and distinct qualities of the original work.

Develop massing & articulation inspired by historic references, establishing an architecture of today that pays homage to that which came before it.








Establishing Hierarchy - Distinct volumes






Axonometric Chronology




